The EDB is confident of the accuracy of the data at the time it was collected. Data from the <u>Bureau of Labor Statistics</u>, O*NET OnLine, <u>CareerOneStop</u> (U.S. Department of Labor), and other government resources was also used to support a complete analysis.





HIGHLIGHTS

- More than 9,900 job postings were advertised in September 2016, an increase of 1,637 postings compared to the same period last year.
- With 921 postings, the Retail Trade industry had the most job postings in the September reporting period.
- Santa Rosa had 199 more job postings than reported a year ago and continues to have the most job postings of any Sonoma County city with 4,500 in September 2016.

MONTHLY TRENDS

September 2016 saw 9,979 job postings, of which 20% were new postings from the previous year. The county unemployment rate dropped from 4.4% in July to 4.1% in August. The drop in unemployment rate may be two-fold as we move out of the typically slower summer hiring months and earlier-than-normal seasonal holiday hiring by the retail industry.



OCCUPATIONAL GROUPS


The top occupational group is Sales and Related Occupations with 1,598 jobs representing 16% of all job postings in September 2016. This is followed by Transportation and Material Moving Occupations with 1,511 postings, and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations with 1,064 postings, accounting for 15% and 11% of all postings respectively. Transportation and Material Moving and Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations saw the greatest growth over the past year by 276% (401 jobs) and 38.92% (185 jobs) additional job postings.

Occupational Groups - Top 10 by job posting volume difference from September 2015 to September 2016






OCCUPATIONS

Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers had the most job postings in September 2016 with 1,187 positions, followed by Retail Salespersons and First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers. Of the Top 15 Occupations, demand for Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers, Light Truck or Delivery Services Drivers, Teacher Assistants, Wholesale and Manufacturing Sales Representatives, and Security Guards increased the most over the year. First-Line Supervisors of Food Preparation and Serving Workers, Cashiers, and Customer Service Representatives experienced weaker job demand as compared to the previous year, yet still remain in the top 10 job postings for September 2016.

Top employers hiring **Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers** today include *Werner, Quest Global OO, HigherPayingDriverJobs.com,* and *SAIA*. In addition, *Target Corporation, Athleta, Dick's Sporting Goods, Inc.,* and *JCPenny* are the top employers hiring **Retail Salespersons** and for **First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers** it is *GameStop, Chico's, Macy's,* and *Mattress Firm*.


Top job openings in the upper middle to high income salary range (\$50K-\$100K) include **Registered** Nurses, Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers, First-Line Supervisors of Retail Sales Workers, Advertising Sales Agents, Wholesale and Manufacturing Sales Representatives, and Medical and Health Services Managers.








Occupations - Top 15 job postings by job posting volume from September 1-30, 2016




Occupations - Top 15 job postings by median salary from September 1-30, 2016

Of the Top 15 job openings in Sonoma County, Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers, Medical and Health Services Managers, and First-Line Supervisors of Food Preparation and Serving Workers had the highest hiring difficulty in September 2016. Employers hiring Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers are detailed on page 4, and employers hiring Medical and Health Services Managers include *St. Joseph Health* System, *Kaiser Permanente, Brookdale*, and *Sutter Health*.





HARD SKILLS, SOFT SKILLS & CERTIFICATIONS

Bilingualism continues to be the number one listed hard skill while experience with **Pediatrics** had the largest percentage increase from the prior year (95.56%). Demand for all soft skills has risen from the prior year by an average of 16.53%, a change from the previous months when soft skills demand was less than the prior year period. This may be influenced by a contracting hiring market, with employers looking for any advantage to improve their postings and recruit qualified employees.

Commercial Driver's License moved to the most wanted certification, edging out Driver's License by just five listings. This is the first time in the past year that Driver's License was not the most in-demand certification. Nine of the top 10 certifications grew in ad volume compared to the previous year. The biggest increase has been in Certified Purchasing Manager (1300%), followed by Commercial Driver's License (576.14%) and Hazmat (53.57%).

INDUSTRY SPOTLIGHT - Manufacturing

October 1, 2015 - September 30, 2016

There were **1,347** job postings for Sonoma County recorded in the Manufacturing Industry from **October 1, 2015** to September **30, 2016**, a decrease of 13.76% from the previous year. The most job postings were for positions located in Petaluma (31.4%), followed by Santa Rosa (29.4%), and Healdsburg (14.4%).

The industry's most advertised occupation is **Industrial Engineers** representing 5.0% of the available job postings followed by **Marketing Managers** representing 4.7%, and **Customer Service Representatives** representing 3.6%.

Employers in the Manufacturing Industry increasingly look for candidates with the following soft skills: Oral and Written Communication Skills, Detail Oriented, Marketing, Microsoft Office, and Creativity. In addition, there is strong demand for the following hard skills: Power systems modeling, Quality assurance, Python, Linux, and Technical support.

The annual median salary from online job postings for the Manufacturing Industry in Sonoma County is **\$61,850**, 8.9% higher than the \$56,800 median salary for all industries from October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016.

The Manufacturing Industry experienced a moderate **hiring difficulty of 43** (1 = easiest to hire, 100 = hardest to hire) from October 1, 2015 to September 31, 2016.


